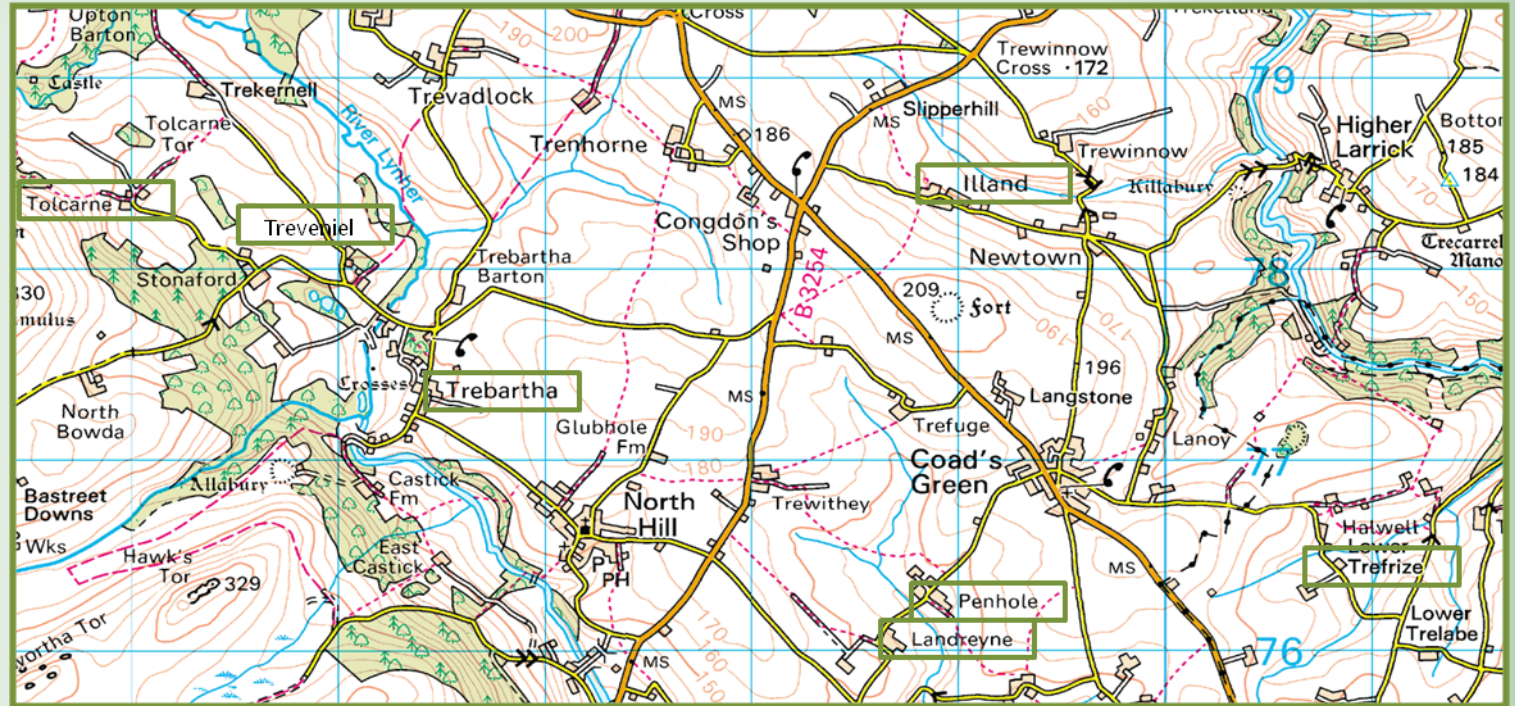


# North Hill in the Domesday Book (1086AD)

In Norman times Cornwall was sparsely populated and underutilised. It was given to Robert Count of Mortain by King William I. It was in Robert's power to grant occupation of the existing manors in exchange for fees and homage.



Seven places in North Hill were mentioned in the Domesday Book

Place name	Domesday Name	Occupier / Owner
Illand	Elent or Heli	Robert, Count of Mortain, wrongfully taken from Tavistock Church; the Abbot claims it back
Landreyne	Lander	Reginald, Earl of Cornwall from Robert, Count of Mortain
Penhole	Polhal	Wulfsize or Wulfsi from Robert, Count of Mortain
Tolcarne	Talgar	Ermenald from Tavistock Church
Trebartha	Tribertham	Thurstan or Turstin the sheriff from Robert, Count of Mortain
Trefrize	Treverim	Reginald, Earl of Cornwall from Robert, Count of Mortain
Treveniel	Treviniel	Information lost
